- Note that it is required that stakeholder comments on the use of the RBF need to be considered (FCP v2.1 Annex PF2.1.1.e). The stakeholder comment and CAB response shall be included in the Public Comment Draft Report (FCP v2.1 7.20.6.a).

In the previous full assessment, the Aleutian Islands stock was merged with the Eastern Bering Sea stock and was assessed as such. Since then, it has split off and as a Tier 5 stock in the NMFS taxonomy of stocks. The assessment document is too general for detailed answers to some of the MSC scoring criteria. It isn't that the assessment document lacks sufficient information about stock status and harvesting, it is just not broken out in ways that readily map only some of the MSC criteria. It will take face to face discussions with the NFMS assessment staff to be confident that we are interpreting the assessment document correctly in the context of the MSC certification criteria and standards. We will investigate in the intervening period whether the RBF will be needed.
