Subject: Request for variation to the MSC Certification Requirement v2.0 FCR-7.4.10 for American Samoa EEZ Albacore and Yellowfin Longline Fishery

Dear Kat Collinson.

I write with reference to your submission on 14/03/2017 of a request for variation to the MSC Certification Requirement (CR) to allow:

Reduction of the UoA to the UoC (only include those vessels under the Starkist Tuna Supply Agreement).

As you are aware, the CR procedures relating to v2.0 FCR-7.4.10 state:

7.4.10 The CAB shall not change the uoA and UoC during the assessment unless:

7.4.10.1 The UoA is announced provisionally in the initial announcement and confirmed later in conformance with 7.10.2

These are integral to ensuring all MSC accredited Conformity Assessment Bodies operate in a consistent and transparent manner. The MSC intends that these requirements be met across all fisheries and CoC certificate holders, except in exceptional, well-justified circumstances, as part of the MSC programme.

MSC notes the factors presented supporting your request, including:

- Reduction of UoA will not impact the sustainability of the fishery.
- Scoring has not yet been undertaken.
- Presently, no vessels outside the UoC have yet entered into supply agreements with Starkist and rarely fish in the American Samoan EEZ or deliver to the American Samoa processing plant.
- •Sufficient information was collected prior to and during the site visit, so that the team can conduct the assessment on the new UoC/A without need for further information requests or additional site visits.

Given the rationale provided, the MSC is willing to grant a variation to the CR in this case subject to the following conditions:

- Stakeholders are informed; and,
- Ecert is updated to reflect the change in UoA.
