	SAI Global would like to provide the Final Report to MSC within 21 months (i.e. 3 additional months) of the full assessment initial announcement, which will be by July 25 th , 2019, instead of by April 25 th , 2019.

3	Justification
	<p>SAI Global is currently carrying out the initial assessment of this fishery. Given the current status of the assessment (see Table 2 section 7), SAI Global will not be in a position to provide a Final Report to MSC within 18 months of the announcement of this assessment due to some factors that led to unforeseen delays in completing the necessary assessment steps:</p> <p>This assessment was initially announced on 25th October 2017 and a site visit was conducted in November 2017. During that initial site visit, it became apparent that there were issues relating to the UoAs and UoCs as originally defined due to the industrial trawl fleet's commonly switching from bottom trawl to midwater trawl on the same fishing trip and not separating their catches by gear type. Therefore, and following the acceptance of a Variation Request by MSC in June 2018, the UoAs and proposed UoCs were re-defined to include both bottom and midwater trawls as scoring elements within the same Unit of Assessment (UoA).</p> <p>After reviewing the data and information collected on the initial audit, the assessment team decided to conduct another site visit which was announced in August 20, 2018. Following a revised announcement in August 2018, a second on-site visit took place in September 2018.</p> <p>The fishery has now progressed to the point where SAI Global provided a draft report to the MSC Peer Review College for review in March 3rd 2019. The need for this extension to allowable timeframes is purely administrative and is necessary in order to complete the relevant assessment stages without being required to withdraw the fishery.</p> <p>All-in-all: 1) the proposed extension is administrative in nature; 2) the time spent to date on this assessment was necessary and could not have been foreseen at the outset, and; 3) the most up to date information will be presented in all subsequent reports.</p>

	<p>A positive response to this VR will allow SAI Global to continue the assessment of this fishery in line with MSC requirements and to ultimately provide a Final Report to MSC.</p> <p>Prior to a Final Report being available to be provided to the MSC the following steps still need to be completed:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - SAI Global to provide draft report to MSC Peer Review College for review (Report Sent in March 3rd 2019). - MSC PRC to provide Peer Reviewer's comments to SAI Global. - The Assessment Team respond to PRC comments

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The Assessment Team add all stakeholder comments to the report and respond to same to create PCDR. - The PCDR is published for a 30 day comment period. - The Assessment Team respond to comments received during the PCDR stage (including possible MSC TO and Peer Reviewers' additional comments) to create Final Report for Determination <p>Given the number of steps and the 30 day comment period for the PCDR that still need to take place before a Final Report can be provided to MSC, it is not possible at this point for a Final Report to be provided within 18 months as required. Therefore, a negative response to this VR will leave SAI Global with no option but to withdraw this fishery from the assessment process.</p>
5	If a fishery assessment, mitigation of the implication for assessment
	<p>SAI Global did not identified any risk to the MSC Program from granting this VR. SAIG confirms that it is not aware at this time of any factor that could result in the fishery not being in compliance with the MSC Fisheries Standard.</p> <p>SAIG informed the client about the VR but not other stakeholders. Stakeholders will be notified once the MSC's response to the VR will be provided.</p>
