6	Justification for use ¹	Stock status reference points are not available, derived either from analytical stock assessment or using empirical approaches. Indeed, taking into consideration the report of the preassessment of Cancale Bay Atlantic Slipper Limpet Dredge Fishery (2012), the time series for monitoring biomass is too short to be used by an assessment model. Instead, it is recommended to use indicators to assess the state of the stock. Available information related to the stock are: the stock biomass and a map tracking between 1996-2004. But biological limits are not described by biological reference points such as Blim or Flim. Finally, referring to point 7.7.6 RBF, its annex and the criteria of Table 3 of the FCR, the use of RBF for PI 1.1.1 is warranted.

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¹ Note that it is required that stakeholder comments on the use of the RBF need to be considered (FCR Annex PF 2.1.1.5). The stakeholder comment and CAB response shall be included in the Public Comment Draft Report (FCR 7.15.4.1).
