	As permitted through and required by Section 1.3 of Derogation 3: Covid-19 Fishery and Chain of Custody Remote Auditing, SCS wishes to conduct portions of an initial assessment of the Tri Marine Pacific Ocean longline tuna fishery remotely. The variation is limited to the initial site visit.

3	Justification			
	The variation is requested to, in part, accommodate for travel risks related to Covid-19 and travel restrictions in the countries where part of the assessment team members are based (USA) and where the site visit would need to take place (Taiwan, Vanuatu, Singapore). The CAB is confident in the capacity and ability of the client, government scientists, and management personnel to support a remote assessment. The CAB will attempt to hold some on-site meetings if it identifies these activities as being essential to the audit (see section 9 for additional justification).

Additional information requested by the MSC:

Regarding the justification of this variation, it is not logistically feasible for the assessment team to hold inperson meetings with all the entities that it will solicit additional information from (client representatives, fishing authority personnel from multiple flag states, researchers, onboard observers, transhipment observers, vessel owners, captains/crew, customs officials, stakeholder groups) because of the quantity of meetings that the team anticipates needing to stage. For this reason, we will conduct remote meetings with the entire assessment team participating via video calls. At the conclusion of these meetings, we will assess the audit's information gaps and conduct in-person meetings accordingly. We provide more information regarding specific meetings and attendees in section 9 (below).

- The variation is limited to the initial site visit.

- Remote portions of the site visit include:

- Client opening and closing meetings (all assessment team members to join via video calls)
- Stakeholder meetings (all assessment team members to join via video calls)
- Principle 1, 2, and 3 discussions/meetings with management and research entities (all assessment team members to join via video calls)

- In-person (lead auditor) portions of the site visit include:

- Additional information discussions, specific to Principle 2, with management entities, observers, customs/inspection officials, fishing authority personnel, captains, crew, and company representatives (P1, P2, and P3 auditors to attend via video calls)
- Traceability meetings with vessel owners, company owners (P1, P2, and P3 auditors to attend via video calls)
