2014 Surveillance Assessment

MSC certification requires annual surveillance assessments of all certified fisheries. This fishery is now entering the 'annual surveillance' stage of the assessment against the MSC Principles and Criteria for Sustainable Fishing.

These annual audits have two principal functions:

1. To review any changes in the management of the fishery, including regulations, key management or scientific staff or stock evaluation
2. To evaluate the progress of the fishery against any Conditions of Certification raised during the Main Assessment

A key purpose of this stage is to collect information on the fishery and in particular to speak to representatives of the fishery, fishery management and environmental management bodies. Should you have any information on this fishery that you feel should be considered in the audit, please advise us. If you do not wish to be interviewed you may submit written information to the assessment team'.

We expect to carry out most meetings in Dartmouth, Nova Scotia on **18th and 19th November 2014**.

- the issues you would like to discuss (in order for us to arrange appropriate representation)
