A revised PCR has been published on the MSC website. Acoura can confirm that none of these changes affect process, scoring or outcome of the report and the determination. A summary of these changes is available below.

Summary of Changes to PCR:

1. Glossary

2. Client Group (UoA table):

The client group includes the companies of Heiploeg Suriname and **Suriname American Industries LTD** (SAIL), the seabob vessels that are owned and operated by Heiploeg Seafoods and SAIL, and such other independently owned vessels as are nominated by either Heiploeg Suriname or SAIL as meeting their fishing and supply standards.

3. 3.2.1 Area Under Evaluation

"The designated seabob trawl zone is stipulated as an appendix to the fishing license and is bounded by a line nominally equivalent to 10 fathom depth contour to a line nominally equivalent to 15 fathom depth contour (Figure 3.1) with extension east of Matapica to 18 fathoms"
