|   | Customers will be informed of this development (if accepted) via emails and phone calls; the client group representative has confirmed this is already being done.<br>All the client group member processing plants currently have inventory of this product and are aware that it can not be sold as MSC unless this variation is granted and until such time as the PCDR is released.<br>All these plants also have the same COC certifier (Intertek) and Intertek is currently doing an audit at one of the plants, and ergo, is up to speed on this development and the requirement to add UMAF in short order.<br>LR statement: As part of the fisheries re-assessment, CoC within the fishery has been reviewed. All landings are subject to dockside monitoring. Landings are either made direct to the processors or stored in bonded cold storage facilities – all of which are subject to existing chain of custody certification and so the facility owners are well versed in the traceability requirements set by MSC. The risk to chain of custody, post landing, is therefore considered to be minimal.<br>The fishery has been certified for 10 years and the client group members have been MSC CoC certified for this period of time and so are well aware of MSC CoC requirements. Therefore, LR considers that the systems in place will ensure UMAF requirements are adhered to. |

|   | This VR was previously accepted for the re-assessment which reached it's 18 month deadline. Given the expiry date of the certificate, the previous re-assessment was done on the basis of an eligibility date of PCDR (i.e. before certification) and the systems in place have been audited to reflect that. Although this date is earlier than PCDR, it presents no other difference in auditing requirements. The PCDR will confirm this approach. This new assessment is based on the previous assessment (began 2018) with an update of the information – there have been no changes that would affect the eligibility date remaining as the 18 <sup>th</sup> September 2019 in relation to this latest assessment process.  |
