1 Proposed variation

MSC FCP v 2.2 in the mentioned clauses requires a 60- day deadline from the end of the site visit for the publication of the surveillance report which is extended to 90 days in case the CAP has to be revised.

DNV GL requests a further extension of 30 days, with the new deadlines as 19.05.2022 and 19.06.20211 respectively.

3 Justification

MSC FCP v2.2 §G7.28.8.1 allows the coordination of site visits with the surveillance audits of other nearby MSC fisheries, thereby minimising the inputs required from management agencies and stakeholders.

The surveillance audits for the mentioned fisheries have been integrated for the client NORGES FISKARLAG. The fisheries all have varying anniversaries and the on-site audits were integrated and implemented at the most viable period for all the relevant fisheries, the client and the availability for the stakeholder interviews. The integrated surveillance audit results in 5 different reports all to be written and approved by the client. DNV GL has experienced that the 30-day extension facilitates the process of finalizing and client approval of the reports before publishing on the MSC website.

The main aim of this Variation Request is to facilitate the near-simultaneous finalizing and client approvals of 5 surveillance reports for continuous certification.

The 30- day extension requested does not affect FCP v2.2 §7.28.8 due to the following:

- All 5 fisheries now have 5 and- a- half year cycle due to the Covid 19 derogation extension of the present certificate.
- The integrated audits for these 5 fisheries are already conducted in accordance with FCP v2.2 §7.28.8.1 and will continue to do so to accommodate adherence to FCP v2.2 § 7.28.9 (4 surveillance audits in a certificate cycle). A 30- day extension, at this stage, has minimal or no effect on this requirement.

Adequate resources, in accordance with GCR v2.4.1 §6; §7.2.1 and §7.2.2 are in place and documented as per requirements.

GCR v 2.4.1 §7.4.3 will not be affected. The audit plan has a closing meeting scheduled with the client and assessment team for 18.02.2021 where any possible material changes to certificate status will be discussed and progress of the relevant fisheries adapted accordingly, irrespective of this Variation Request. The requirements in this clause will, therefore, not be affected by this Variation Request.

4 Implications for assessment

The implications for the assessment are not considered material to the sustainability of the fishery. The only implication for the surveillance assessments is that the process will extend **30 days** beyond the original required timeline.
