### **Proposed variation**

Surveillance audits to be held in September instead of the certificate anniversary date in August (1 month postponement).

### Rationale/Justification

Upon consultations with fishery clients, scientists and managers, the current timing of the audit at the anniversary of the certification date (August) will consistently conflict with availability of key staff that would be interviewed at onsite meetings.

US Sablefish qualifies for reduced surveillance, but there is a possibility that we may be expanding the scope of the certificate starting at this year's audit. Many of the same staff from NMFS work on both P. halibut and sablefish fisheries, so it makes sense to interview them at the same time for the fisheries.

SCS proposes to move the surveillance audit dates to September when the schedules of key staff are more available for onsite meetings and to maintain efficiencies in linking this audit with US P. halibut annual surveillance.

Note: the surveillance level of this fishery is 'reduced.'
