Richard Banks has considerable MSC experience having served as the Lead Assessor for four prawn trawl fisheries in Australia and on the PNA free school skipjack full assessment. Richard has also designed several fishery improvement plans in South East Asia and the Pacific, and acted as external reviewer to a number of MSC assessments on behalf of WWF. Richard currently works as an advisor to FFA, MFMR, and PNA as an offshore tuna advisor. Richard is an economist and fisheries management and policy programming specialist having worked on similar issues for international agencies, Commonwealth and State Fisheries. Prior to joining MRAG Asia Pacific, Mr Souter was the Fisheries Adviser to the two previous Australian Government Ministers for Fisheries and oversaw the development and delivery of all Australian Government fisheries-related policies and programmes. Highlights included playing a key role in the design and roll out of the \$220m Commonwealth Securing our Fishing Future package, including the design and implementation of a new Commonwealth fisheries harvest strategy policy. Before joining the Minister’s Office, Mr Souter was Chief Executive Officer of the Queensland Seafood Industry Association, the peak representative body for the \$300m Queensland seafood industry. Mr Souter has extensive practical experience with fisheries and aquatic resource management issues including fisheries policy, planning and research, marine protected areas and coastal zone management. Mr Souter is a past Director of the Cooperative Research Centre for the Great Barrier Reef and has served on numerous fisheries policy and science related advisory committees. <p>Audit/review time and location</p>	<p>The surveillance will take place in November 9-13, 2015.</p> <p>A remote surveillance is justified in this case as follows:</p> <p>The ability to verify information remotely is high. There are ample opportunities and mechanisms to engage with clients and stakeholders including electronic forms of communication such as phone conferencing, video conferencing, and email. Fishery reports and other documented evidence that can be used to demonstrate progress against conditions and other issues relevant to the MSC</p>

	<p>Principles and criteria can be easily and transparently checked remotely.</p> <p>There are no milestones that require investigation of physical aspects of the fishery.</p>
Assessment/ review activities	<p>The surveillance will review any changes in science and management, and will monitor progress in closing out conditions: initiating the process to develop control rules that have a more scientific basis; establishing a specific monitoring program for both habitats and the ecosystem; and explicitly incorporating the precautionary approach into the decision-making process.</p>
