Notification - Determination and Release of Final Report for Stakeholder Consultation

The Determination reached by the Conformity Assessment Body is that Falkland Island toothfish **should be re-certified according to the MSC Principles and Criteria for Sustainable Fisheries.**

The Final Report relating to this re-assessment is now available on the MSC website. Please note that this is a determination, not a final certification result. This fishery is therefore not re-certified until the final consultation period has been concluded and a certificate has been issued.

There is now a 15 working-day period during which any party that disagrees with this determination and that has previously provided input to the assessment (or can establish that necessary procedures were not followed to seek their involvement prior to this point) may send a written statement of intent to lodge an objection.
