	As previously described, an early surveillance audit was announced for the Eastern Canada Offshore Lobster fishery on the 15th February 2019, with a site visit on the 12th April 2019. This surveillance audit includes a full review of the circumstances surrounding the convictions against Clearwater Seafoods from DFO that have been brought to our attention. The surveillance has therefore required an in-depth review of all the related documents, some of which require lengthy formal processes to request from the court and prosecution. LR now have all the documents relating to the fishery and the report has been issued to the client with the findings – which includes two new conditions. These require Client Action Plans (CAPs) from the client, which they are undertaking in collaboration with DFO. They have communicated that completing the Client Action Plans within the current timeframe is not achievable and LR are therefore requesting an extra 30 days, to give them chance to develop the plans, and get the required input from external sources. We have requested 30 extra days in accordance with the new V2.1 process, which permits 30 extra days when a new condition has been raised to allow the client time to generate action plans.
