Proposed variation

The initial description of the unit of certification identified a set of participating fishing companies. The client wishes to have the flexibility to add more fishing companies to the unit of certification. We, therefore, propose to change the unit of certification for from a list of specific companies to all eligible fishing companies under a certificate sharing arrangement. The client will add companies to the approved list per a certificate sharing agreement.

Rationale/Justification

As the assessment has generated publicity in the region to the benefits of certification, more companies have expressed a desire to participate in the assessment. Allowing more companies to participate will increase the incentives of the participating companies to maintain fishing operations in compliance with the MSC standard, and provide an incentive of currently non-participating companies to join. A certificate sharing agreement will offer an opportunity for new entrants, and give the clients assurance that all new participants fully comply with financial and operational procedures set by the clients and with conditions set by the CB.

Yes. During the site visit the CB and Clients met with 10 companies not currently participating in the assessment plus companies already involved. They had an opportunity to ask questions about the assessment and its implications.

Further Comments

We submit that the flexibility to allow new participating fishing companies into the Aniva Bay unit of certification will enhance the sustainability of the fishery as an expanding number of companies will exert increasing peer pressure on non-participants to improve fishing practices and have will increased influence on government agencies to improve fishery management and hatchery operational practices.
