

## MSC Evaluation of the Owasebussan Co. Ltd. North Pacific Longline Tuna Fishery for Albacore, Yellowfin Tuna & Bigeye Tuna

## ANNOUNCEMENT OF FINAL REPORT AND DETERMINATION

The Marine Stewardship Council (MSC) process for independently evaluating the fishery above is moving forward in the Assessment Process. The assessment team has reviewed all comments on the report and supporting documentation and has determined that the fishery meets the MSC requirements for a well-managed and sustainable fishery.

This is not the certification decision. The determination is now open for a final objection period no less than 15 working days. Any stakeholder that has participated in the assessment thus far may lodge an objection on the positive determination.

The MSC has prescribed procedures for fishery certification objection as well as a special form for stakeholders to lodge the objection.
